The National Curriculum

The context for the teaching of English, Maths, Science, Art and Design, Computing, Design and Technology, Geography, History, Languages, Music and Physical Education is set out in the Programmes of Study of The National Curriculum for England.

For Religious Education we use the Milton Keynes 'Agreed Syllabus'. This is a discovery approach using 'learning from' and 'learning about' a variety of religions.

Summerfield has designed a programme to deliver Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education which includes aspects such as British Values and how we can contribute as citizens. PSHEE is an integral part of everyday lessons and is reinforced regularly during daily assemblies.

In addition to the statutory knowledge, understanding and skills specified in 'The National Curriculum in England,' we take every opportunity to provide our children with an enriched learning experience. We are proud of our status as an Artsmark Gold school. This is a recognition of the high quality expressive and creative opportunities we offer.

We regularly take our children on educational trips and visits and invite outside providers to add interest, depth and breadth to the curriculum.

In addition to a wide range of sports activities, we use our extensive grounds including our wildlife area, vegetable patch and wildflower meadow to develop understanding of the environment and issues affecting it.

- Visit two places of worship
- Have the opportunity to take part in a residential visit
- Take part in an 'Enterprise Project'

All children will have the opportunity to:

- Have work displayed in school or on the school website
- Perform on a theatre stage to an audience
- Learn a musical instrument
- Join a musical group (e.g. Ensemble, Samba, Rock & Pop, Recorders, Ukulele, Choir)
- Use ICT to create short animated films and learn film techniques
- Take part in intra and inter schools sports competitions.
- Take part in local and national Competitions, Events and Exhibitions
