

EYFS/KS1

Year 1 have launched into the Summer term as Superheroes! Our Immersion day involved creating our own Superheroes, looking at comic art and discussing real-life superheroes who help us. We even shared what superpowers we would like and what makes us super.

We have been loving our 'structures' DT project, going on a local walk to discuss materials used in building, the shapes we could see and what makes buildings strong. We tested our knowledge by designing and constructing tall, strong buildings which we tested with a hairdryer! We are looking at

maps, map symbols and aerial photographs in Geography, making maps of the school and spotting human and physical features in the environment.

In English, we are reading 'Supertato, Veggies Assemble!' and developing our writing skills to create our own superhero character descriptions.

In Maths, we are looking at place value within 50 and understanding the concept of tens and ones.

We have dived into the Summer term and made a big 'splash' with our swimming lessons. We have already seen a great improvement in all the children with their water confidence and we are only on Week 2! Keep up this amazing progress Year 3!

Our Year 3 Immersion Day showed just how creative our Year 3 children are! We had children dressed ready to explore different parts of the world from Disneyland America, Japan and Hawaii to the outback in Australia. We began with a catwalk to show off our outfits. We then started our exploration of 4 of the world's major biomes and worked in teams to create an outstanding Humanities display, in our display takeover!





KS2 Upper


This half-term Year 5 are Cracking the Code! In Geography, we are learning practical skills such as using compasses and reading Ordnance Survey Maps. For our Immersion day, Owls class used those skills to find some clues hidden around the school. The clues told Owls the code to the safe, which after a few attempts they successfully opened to find the treasure inside.

Year 5 are very much looking forward to Science this half-term as we are looking at

the life cycles of different animals and plants.

We will be studying closely the life cycle of a Butterfly by growing our own

caterpillars and watching them metamorphosis into butterflies.




Squirrels Class will be doing a Sponsored Walk around Bradwell Common
