




EYFS/KS1






Supporting your Year 6 child with SATs...

Tips for preparing your child

- Ensure children complete all homework/ test papers on the date they are required to, and offer your help if needed.
- Listen to your children read every evening, and question them on their understanding of the text.
- Test your children on their spellings (these are now an important part of the Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar test) and times tables, which are equally as important.



- Ensure children go to bed at a reasonable time (this may seem a strange request but tiredness really affects some children's learning and we want them to have the best chance of achieving their full potential).
- Keep time spent on electrical devices: play stations, T.Vs etc. to a minimum.
- Chat to your children about how they have got on at the end of the day. Encourage them not to worry and to try and enjoy the week.

During SATS week to provide the children with a good start to the day and as a special treat, we are putting on a free of charge breakfast club, for those who have given consent. This will be available every morning at 8.15am, and we look forward to seeing all the children there as this is an ideal way to eat, chat and relax before each paper is completed.

<u>CENSUS DAY</u> — On Thursday 16th May it is National School Census Day.


Please help us with our Government funding by ordering your child a school lunch on this day through SchoolGrid.
