EYFS/KS1

Squirrels Walk...



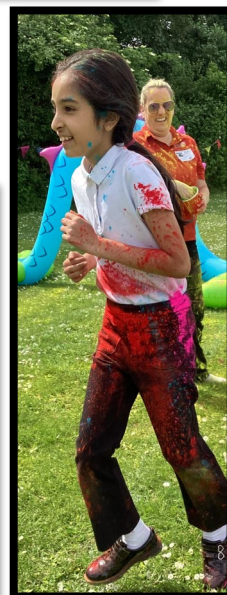
On Thursday 16th May, Squirrels' children took part in a sponsored walk to raise funds towards their school trip.

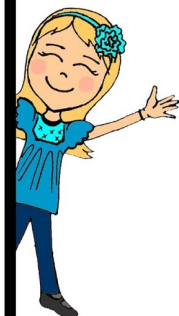
