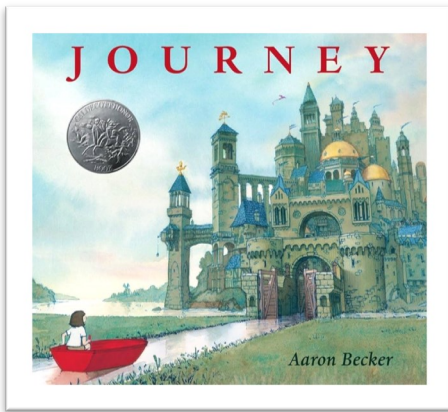

## EYFS/KS1



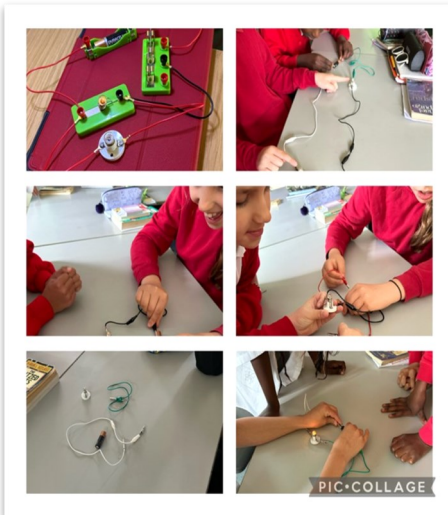
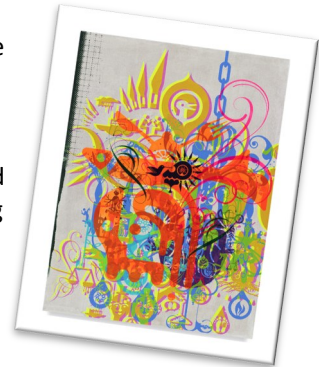
In Year One we have begun our new topic of 'Far, Far Away'. We are reading the story of 'Journey' by Aaron Becker and working on creating our own magical journey stories.

In Maths we are learning all about Multiplication and Division and how these can be represented as arrays/ groups of.

In Science we are learning all about Animals including Humans. We will learn all about different types of animals including Carnivores, Herbivores and Omnivores and

how different animals are classified into these groups.

In Art we are looking at the artist Ryan McGinness and designing and printing using recycled materials.



## KS2 Lower

In our last half term, so far Year 4 have been very busy indeed. We took assessments in Reading and Maths. After that we took our official times-tables tests. Our teachers were proud of how calm and responsible we were.

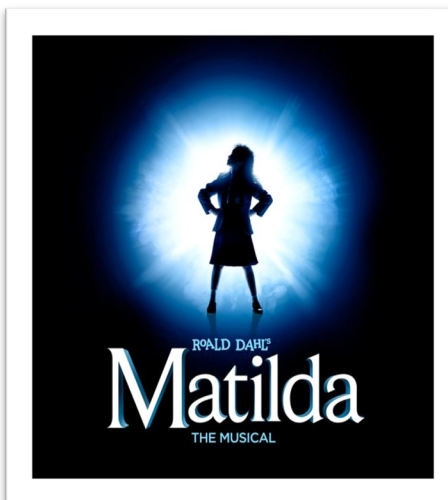
We have also learnt the rules of Rounders and played together with great team spirit on the field, despite the wet weather!

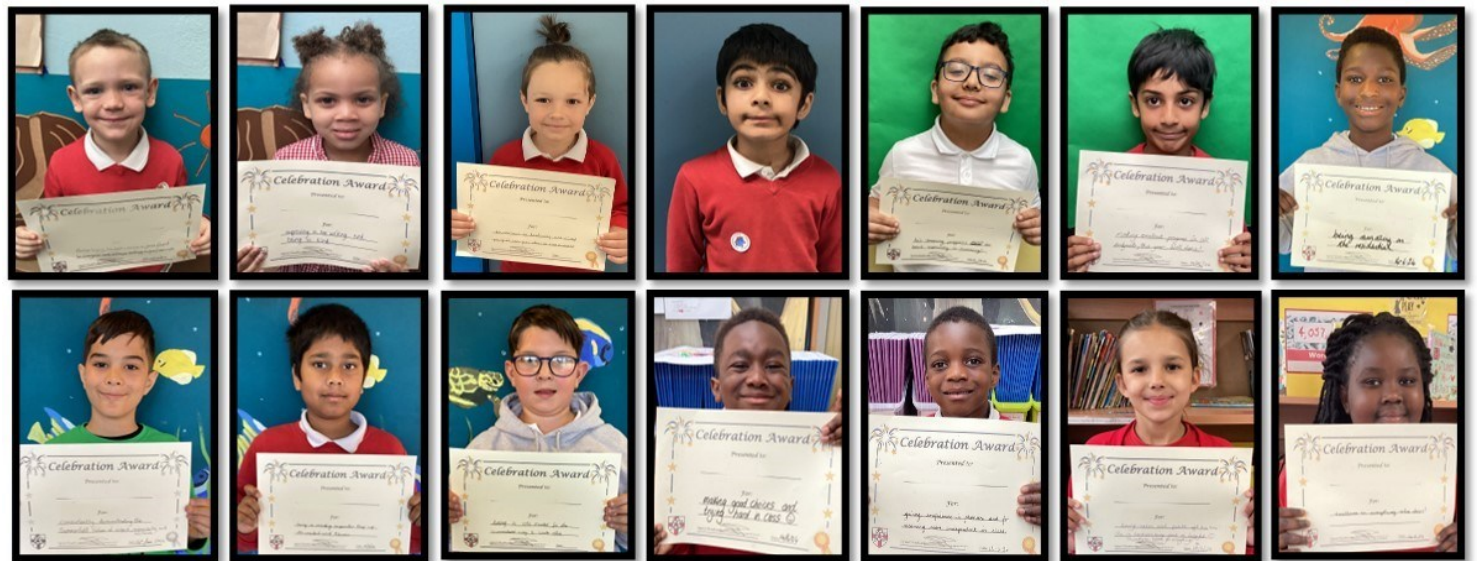

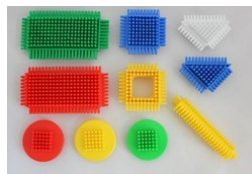
Do you have any pre-loved toys in good condition, fully working and clean?



% of donor population with each group:




Who can donate?
