Well done, Year 2!




## KS2 Lower


Are you having a tidy-up at home?

### **FSM VOUCHER FOR SUMMER BREAK:**

Further to our previous communication regarding Free School Meal (FSM) vouchers and the HAF summer programme, please below details for FSM vouchers for one week of the summer break.

Milton Keynes Council has secured continued funding as part of the Household Support Fund which means that students eligible for free school meals **and** those families who are in receipt of Universal Credit or Working Tax Credit, will receive an e-voucher during the first week of the summer break to the value of £15 per eligible child.

The vouchers will be issued from 20<sup>th</sup> July 2024.

Evidence of a benefit entitlement to Universal Credit or Working Tax Credit in the form of a statement should be emailed to <a href="mailto:finance@summerfieldschool.org">finance@summerfieldschool.org</a> by the deadline of Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2024 for us to process vouchers for your child/ren. Where information is not received by this deadline, we will be unable to issue a voucher and we wish to avoid this.

Please note, we do not require an email with evidence from families whose children already qualify for Free School Meals. **Meals** – please ensure any meals ordered on SchoolGrid are paid for promptly or any meals no longer required are cancelled by the deadline to avoid any additional charges.




MUSIC LESSONS - For those children who are registered, reminder that the payment for Autumn Term 2024 needs to be received by 10<sup>th</sup> July 2024.
