












EYFS/KS1

GETTING READY FOR SCHOOL:

Mornings are a very busy time for all families! We are seeing an increased number of forgotten items being handed to the school office throughout the day. Please make sure school bags are packed the night before or allow enough time in the mornings to make sure your child has everything they need with them. This includes items such as; lunch boxes, water bottles, musical instruments, coats, reading glasses etc. Thank you for your co-operation.

AUTOMATIC GATES:

School gates open at 08:00am for breakfast club and automatically close at 09:15am. The school day starts at 08:45am where children will be engaging in early morning work. Lateness even by 5 minutes means your child is missing out on essential learning time.

School finishes at 3:15pm. The gates will automatically open at 3:00pm and close at 3:45pm. If you are late collecting your child after 3:20pm they will automatically be sent to Jolly Junglers Care Club and you will be charged.

ADMISSIONS FORM—NEW STARTERS:

If your child has just started here at Summerfield School, please make sure you have fully completed the Admissions Form. This helps us with important information about your child, including medical/dietary requirements and emergency contact numbers. Please contact the school office if you require help with completing the form.

MEDICAL INFORMATION:

Please make sure you have notified us of any changes to your child's medical and/or dietary needs. If there is an emergency at school, we will not be able to assist your child effectively if you have not given us correct and current information. It is your responsibility to make sure you have given us up-to-date medication, including in-date asthma pumps.

If your child has a medical condition and requires medication to be given at school, please come to the office to collect an 'Administration of Medication' form for you to complete. Please note that we are only allowed to administer antibiotics if they are prescribed 4 times a day.

APPOINTMENTS:

Please can we remind families that GP Doctor appointments and Dentist appointments need to be taken **BEFORE 08:45am** when school starts or **AFTER 3:15pm** when school finishes. Having medical appointments during school hours is disruptive to your child's day and interrupts class learning. Not only does your child miss essential learning time, but it also can be unsettling to a class to see a child leave. We understand that for emergency and hospital appointments these need to be taken when given, but when booking a GP Doctor or Dentist appointment, please choose before or after the school day. Thank you for your co-operation.

Census Day...

Every year, Summerfield is required to complete three statutory returns to the Department for Education. Part of the information sent is a review of



the number of meals taken on Census Day (the next one is on Thursday 3^{rd} October) from children who are eligible for <u>Universal School Meals / FSM or</u> Pupil Premium.

The Department of Education will fund schools the money for meals based on the number of meals taken on this specific day for these children. So, if your child did not take the meal on the 3rd October but then you decided later in the year for your child to take up their free meal, school would not have the funds to pay for this; the school budget overall would be reduced significantly. We would then have less money to put towards school resources e.g., pens, pencils and exercise books.

On the 3rd October to ensure we can receive the full funding, your child (universal school meals / FSM or pupil premium children) has been booked a meal based on their dietary requirements held by school for those that have not already booked.

Please help us by **not sending in a home packed lunch on Thursday 3rd October**. As we have to record the actual meals taken, if you allow your child to have home packed lunch we lose the funding for them for the whole year and this has a huge impact on our ability to spend and resource across the curriculum.

We appreciate your support in this matter and thank you in advance for your help.
