


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EYFS/KS1


The children in Early Years have been very busy this term!

In Literacy, the children have been exploring the stories 'The Naughty Bus', 'Room on the Broom' and 'The Gingerbread Man'.

The children have been sequencing the stories and writing simple words and sentences from the stories.

In Maths, the children have been exploring numbers to five and looking at shapes in our environment.

During Topic we have been exploring celebrations around the world and the children have been sharing their experiences.





KS2 Lower

This term Year 4 have been exploring states of matter in Science. We have been very successful in being little Scientists by doing reversible experiments with solids and liquids. Our first experiment involved melting chocolate using our body temperatures and observing how long each one of us took to melt the chocolate in the palms of our hands. Our next experiment was to turn a liquid into a solid by freezing juice and then allowing it to dilute overtime in water. We really enjoyed being creative by writing up our Science experiments with diagrams and explanations.





KS2 Upper

Year 5 have had a fantastic few weeks. We have finished the History part of our topic on Law and Order and on Thursday afternoon we had a visit from two Police Community Support Officers and one Police Officer. They told us all about their roles, answered lots of questions and brought in some uniform for Year 5 to try out. We learnt that children can indeed be arrested from the age of 10 (but only if they have committed a serious crime). We also found out that if anyone forgot to wear any part of their uniform they would have to go out and buy doughnuts for their team! Year 5 and Year 6 also had an entertaining afternoon on Wednesday 4th December when they walked to Planet Ice MK to watch Aladdin on Ice. The ice-skaters were amazing, the children all enjoyed the show (and their snacks) and we all enjoyed the opportunity to show we were the loudest school at the show!







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




