

Year 2 started this half term immersing themselves into our new topic 'Location, Location'. The children made apple crumble and muffin pizzas that linked with our English text 'The Country Mouse and the Town Mouse. They wrote a set of instructions for both their apple crumble and pizza. Some children asked for the recipes and even went on to make them again at home. In Geography, they are comparing human and physical features of rural and urban settings (UK and non-UK). In Maths, we have learned about the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. We have now moved on to money and they have recapped names of coins and pound notes, counting, and comparing amounts of money and working out change. In Art, they will be practising their pencil and sketching skills. In DT, they will be designing and building a house using a range of tools, materials and components. In Science, they are learning about how animals have adapted to their environments. All the Year 2 team are very impressed with the children's effort and engagement. Well done, Year 2!

We are looking forward to making and eating our creations!




KS2 Upper


OPAL UPDATE FROM MRS KATE STUART

Packed lunches should aim to include:


Some starchy foods such as bread (sliced bread, pitta bread, wraps, bagels), pasta, couscous; choose wholegrain if possible

Dairy food such as cheese or yoghurt

Meat, fish, or another source of protein such as eggs, beans and pulses, hummus, falafel Oily fish once every 3 weeks e.g. sardines or salmon

We are proud to be supporting Willen Hospice with their World Book Day Costume Sale.


Come and join us in the School Hall on: Wednesday 12th February 3:15pm—3:45pm.

Please remember that as a school, we have a lot to communicate with you.


We often send you emails and in-app messages on Weduc as well as posts to the Weduc newsfeed.
